

The Ins and Outs of Vaginal Prolapses

There is nothing more frustrating than finding your best ewe, late in gestation, down and straining with her vagina inverted, and knowing this probably won't end well. As a producer, you mainly deal with your own flock, but as a veterinarian, I see problems on hundreds of farms. So when we consider vaginal prolapses, why do some farms have several and repeat prolapses, while others have none? This article will discuss the

factors that lead to that, and give you tips and advice to hopefully help you prevent this problem.

The single most important contributing factor to vaginal prolapse is increased abdominal pressure. People who love and spend every waking moment with their sheep generally keep them too fat. The presence of pelvic and abdominal fat takes up much needed room, and crowds the abdomen. A ewe with a 3 out of 5 body condition score has much less chance of prolapsing than a fat girl.

Multiple fetuses also cause increased pressure and increase likelihood of prolapse. Ewes carrying twins and triplets have more risk, and should be separated if possible and fed less roughage and more grain, to keep the rumen from being too full. An important point to remember is that ruminants eat to meet energy requirements, not to fill space like humans do. Therefore, if your hay is poor quality, and providing very little energy, ewes will stand and eat 24 hours per day, and still not get what they need. This leads to a huge rumen, and increased pressure, and hence a prolapse. So

> smaller amounts of higher quality hay is much better in late gestation ewes.

> While we are on nutrition, I personally see more prolapses in ewes fed alfalfa in late gestation. Legumes are higher in estrogens, causing redness and swelling of the vulva, and relaxation of muscles around the vulva. When these ewes lay down, and combine with high abdominal

pressure, prolapse occurs. Save your alfalfa for lactation, when it pays dividends.

There is absolutely a genetic component of vaginal prolapses. Ewes that prolapse tend to raise ewe lambs with a higher tendency of prolapse. After the crisis is over, I recommend selling the ewe, and any daughters that exist in the flock. Culling is a lot like weight loss, the concept is easy, it's just that nobody seems to follow through with it.

The majority of treatments should probably be left to your veterinarian. Vaginal stitches, prolapse spoons, and caesarean sections are all viable options for treating vaginal prolapses. Spoons in particular can be placed by shepherds, and I encourage you to research them and watch videos on proper placement. Ewes can lamb with these in, and often raise healthy lambs. Prolapse harnesses are the most common treatment that owners use. These must be adjusted to fit tightly, and ewes can lamb through them also.

If you attempt to replace a vaginal prolapse without veterinary help, place the ewe's rear legs up over a 36 inch panel or board supported on each end. This will keep the rear end higher, and allow the abdominal content to fall forward, and make replacing the prolapse much easier.

By now, you should understand that preventing vaginal prolapses is much easier than treating them, and results in live, healthy lambs and a more profitable program. So repeat after me. I will keep my ewe flock body condition at a 3 to 3.5, I will feed smaller amounts of higher quality grass hay and supplement with grain during late gestation, I will save my alfalfa for lactation, and I WILL SELL any ewe with a history of prolapsing, and any daughter from her in the flock. This is how you become one of the farms that never needs me to fix a prolapse. Happy lambing!

Things to Consider When Buying or Selling Katahdins

Lately I have received several calls and observed various social media posts about issues that have occurred between buyers and sellers of Katah-

dins with the desire of involving our office in litigating their dispute. Often the problem is lack of communication between the parties on what the expectations are of the animals involved in the transaction.

REGISTRATION AND TRANSFER

Just because an animal has registered parents does not mean the resulting offspring are regis-

tered, but are eligible to be registered. If you as a buyer want them to be registered it must be communicated to the seller that it is your expectation that they be. Also this would involve that ownership be transferred to the buyer. The cost of this could be an

additional 8 to 32 dollars per head depending on the animal's age and if the animal is transferred within 60 days from date of sale. Make sure that this is discussed with those expectations listed on the bill of sale and who is to

pay the cost.

The same can apply to a registered animal, just because they have papers does not mean they are selling with papers. Discuss this at time of sale and list on the bill of sale your expectations.

HEALTH AND WELL-BEING

Sale of sheep across state lines requires an interstate certificate of

veterinary inspection. This gives the purchaser some assurance that the animals were free from communicable and infectious disease at the time that they were inspected. Other than that it is a buyer beware situation.


Additional tests for other diseases or genetic conditions that you require need to be discussed prior to purchase and made part of the purchase agreement. Complaints after the fact make KHSI powerless in the resolution of the situation. Sheep purchased out of consignment sales need to meet the health requirements of that sale. Any requirements a purchaser requires beyond that need to be satisfied prior to purchase in a sale. Requirements and testing after purchase are at the buyer's risk.

Animals as Breeders

The standard sale guarantee of the purebred sheep industry reads something like this:

Animals are guaranteed to be breeders if properly handled. A string of shows is not considered as proper handling for the initial breeding season.

If a ram fails to breed the seller has the right to check the animal in ques-







Member NSIP OPP neg Scrapie Export Certified tion with a breeding soundness exam administered by a veterinarian. If he passes he is considered a breeder no refund or replacement is required. If he fails the seller has the right to refund the full purchase price or replace it with a ram of equal value to the satisfaction of the buyer. If a ram does not breed it is the purchaser's responsibility to insure a lambcrop by introducing a "check ram" after the initial ram is removed. The seller of a nonbreeding ram cannot be held responsible for a lack of lambcrop.

In the case of a ewe the seller can take the ewe and attempt to get her bred. If successful the resulting bred ewe is returned to the purchaser. If not seller has the right to refund the full purchase price or replace it with a ewe of equal value to the satisfaction of the buyer.

If a ewe is sold as bred and fails to lamb it is generally accepted that 20%

of the purchase price be refunded. Once again the designation of "bred" needs to be listed on the bill of sale. With pregnancy testing technology, a positive pregnancy check can act as proof of the ewe being bred at time of sale and remove the seller from any responsibility after that time.

NSIP DATA

NSIP (National Sheep Improvement Program) data is a tool to be used by the buyer to select animals that are purchased. If is not available at time of selection getting it later is of little value to you. NSIP EBVs change as more data is obtained. The purchaser needs to expect this as a common occurrence and should not expect refunds or compensation for such.

Online Sales

Read the sale warranty. Most online sales have very limited warranties. Communicate with the consignor prior to purchasing an animal online if you expect warranties beyond the sale standard and get it in writing prior to making the purchase.


SUMMARY

Each transaction between buyer and seller is unique to that sale. Record the conditions and expectations of the sale on the purchase agreement. This protects both parties and can be used to help KHSI resolve the situation if need be. Also both parties need to treat the other as they would expect to be treated if the situation were reversed.

As a seller you need to strive to "keep the customer satisfied". Going the extra mile can go a long way in building a reputation as a reputable breeder. The buyer also needs to do some homework. Ask around about the breeder that you are considering investing in their breeding stock. Ultimately it is always buyers beware!







KHSI Members in the News - Camren Maierle, ALB Sustainability Director

ALB HIRES SUSTAINABILITY DIRECTOR

The American Lamb Board is pleased to introduce its sustainability director, Camren Maierle, Ph.D. He will lead ALB's research and producer education initiatives in this area and contribute to advancing the sheep industry's commitment to sustainability, one of the top priorities for the checkoff-funded association.

In this new position – the first one added since ALB began more than 20 years ago – Maierle's initial focus will be to develop and maintain a nationally recognized solar grazing education program, cultivate other contract grazing opportunities, and work with industry partners to improve American lamb sustainability.

Maierle will also manage many aspects of the Climate Smart Grant, which is being finalized between



USDA and ALB. In addition, he will help develop educational tools and mitigation strategies based upon the checkoff-funded Michigan State University project outcomes and implement with the industry.

Maierle is uniquely qualified to fulfill the role of sustainability director for the American Lamb Board. An

Ohio native, he has a bachelor's degree in animal science from Ohio State University, and both master's and doctoral degrees in animal and food science from West Virginia University. Maierle has most recently been a livestock extension educator with Penn State University Extension, leading schools for sheep producers.

Maierle begins with ALB part-time on July 1 as he transitions from his Penn State Extension role, going full-time on Oct. 1. He is in the process of moving back to the family farm in Ohio and will be working remotely from there.

"I'm excited to apply my passion for the sheep industry and dedication to practical, science-based education to this role," Maierle said. "Opportunities of this magnitude for the sheep industry are rare and I fear, if missed, the industry will not have time to reclaim our seat at the table."



Katahdins for Solar Grazing - Balanced Isn't Boring

In life we tend to be drawn to extremes whether it's good for us or not. We are like flies drawn to a flame for extreme stunts, extreme personalities, extreme politicians etc. In

the sheep business many seem to be drawn to extreme size, extreme sale prices, extreme advertising, etc. Many seem to think "balanced" is boring in our business.

What we must understand is in the much broader sheep market that includes the commercial sheep producer "balanced" is what makes them their living raising sheep. Extremes

cost the commercial producer typically in input costs and production losses. As we look at what product we should be producing for the broadest market we have "balanced" is what is needed.

I recently attended the MWSRS in Sedalia MO and was able to speak with many of the Katahdin breeders there. It was interesting to me what each breeder had to say about their respective lots. I made sure up front to tell the breeders I was there looking for breeding rams for commercial Katahdin and Dorper cross ewes. Many of the breeders started out telling me how much the sire to their lots currently weighed which isn't on the radar for most commercial producers needs. It could be a reason not to buy sheep that are getting too big. Others would go into which of the NSIP data points they focused on breeding for. Typically, that was just one main data point they focused on out of the many available. I only remember two or three producers telling me that they were working towards producing a balanced animal that would excel in the production-based scenario. I can tell you the breeders working towards a balanced animal that excels in many scenarios will be ones left standing after the flash in the pan extremes play out.

If we continue to pursue extremes like many other breeds have in the past, we will eliminate most of the production qualities of the animal tion-based model that will have a large base of customers nationwide for years to come. There is a very large commercial market desperately needing sheep that come from a production-based model that uses data to make decisions. Sheep that survive on their own, raise twins, and produce a

quality carcass for market in a reasonable time are what we need in the commercial world.

Don't let advertised extremes guide the future of your great breed. Let data and the largest customer base drive the business.

Balanced isn't boring...balanced makes real money.



that provide the biggest base customer for the product. I think if you looked around the barns at Sedalia you would see several breeds that have done that and effectively have become a show barn only animal that has very little value outside of selling to the handful of other show breeders that were there. Their sale prices and volume tell the story...or should if we are paying attention.

ASK THE EXPERT

Ask The Expert is a new addition to the Katahdin Hairald Magazine that started in the summer of 2023 issue. This short article was added to the quarterly magazine in hopes of providing some answers or clarity to questions that members have submitted to the questionnaire. We will focus questions on upcoming flock activities that may be taking place on your farm soon. This fall's issue will focus on questions submitted about nutrition and grazing. As a committee, we would like to thank those breeders that have taken the time out of their busy schedules to answer these questions and give their opinion on certain topics!

DO YOU FEED KEEPER RAM LAMBS DIFFERENTLY THAN KEEPER EWE LAMBS? GRAIN, HAY, PROTEIN, ETC.

Same feed. Same hay. Same mineral. Nursing lambs have access to free choice creep feed 16% to 18% protein for the first 30-60 days. Then 14% protein commodity mix (steam rolled corn, oats, soyhull pellets, corn gluten pellets, coccidiostat, ammonia chloride, mineral pack). At weaning, ewe lambs and ram lambs are separated. They continue to eat the same 14% feed ration. We offer free choice mineral, loose salt and sodium bicarbonate. The sodium bicarbonate helps balance pH, improves digestion and reduces urinary calculi.

WHAT KIND OF GRASS SHOULD I USE FOR SHEEP PASTURES?

In our area, common bermudagrass, crabgrass and fescue would be considered native grasses and seem to be adequate for sheep grazing. The addition of a legume to your pasture will improve grazing quality and pasture health. Orchard grass does not grow well in our area but is an excellent grass for cooler climates and is very palatable. Keep pasture growth above 3-4 inches and rotate as often as feasible. Sheep are good browsers (not as good as goats) and do a good job of cleaning unwanted weeds/brush

like pigweed, privet hedge, multiflora rose, etc. We like to add small grain annuals like wheat, barley, rye and oats to pastures for winter/spring grazing. Soil samples, pH and proper fertilization are important for successful pasture management.



WHAT IS THE AVERAGE SHEEP (KATAHDIN EWES) HD/ACRES AND EWE/LAMB PAIRS/ACRE?

Generally, 5-6 ewes or ewe units per acre is feasible. The number of sheep per acre would be determined by the type and availability of forage, soil fertility and rainfall. Would caution over grazing or over population. Running fewer than the max per acre likely would improve efficiency, performance, and flock health. We raised registered Angus cattle for over 40 years and always planned our grazing rate with the potential of a drought in mind. If our cattle numbers could be sustained in the drought years, then they certainly were in position to thrive in the wetter years.

ARE PROTEIN TUBS A GOOD OPTION? I HAVE A SMALL OPERATION AND FOR SURE A BEGINNER. IF I PROVIDED A LOOSE FREE CHOICE SHEEP MINERAL AND A LESS EXPENSIVE PROTEIN TUB, WOULD THIS WORK WELL FOR SUPPLEMENTATION?

No doubt, sheep like protein tubs. The tubs will improve body condition and most likely improve conception. But can you afford them? At approximately \$130.00 per 200 pound tub, this equates to \$1,300.00 per ton. At one-half pound consumption per head per day or 182.5 pounds per ewe per year at \$0.65 cost per pound totals \$118.62. That is a lot of added cost. If you have poor

forage and/or a poor feed source, then the tubs may be your answer and likely will be helpful. Also, if you are a purebred producer breeding highend seedstock and show stock, the tubs may well be the edge you need to insure high end performance. But, if you are a commercial producer selling strictly lambs at market price, then I would think you would have to take



a long look at the economics of using protein tubs. If you decide to use protein tubs, in my opinion, the cheap ones are a waste of time. The more expensive tubs are a better product, and you will get better results.

As an addendum to these questions/answers, I'd like to recommend to any new shepherds that they get a copy of Dr. Kennedy's book Pipestone's Veterinary Guide to Sheep and Goats. An easy read, common sense and thorough coverage of sheep health, feeding and management practices. Book is available at Premier 1 Sheep Supply and most sheep supply businesses.

Silas Gingerich, Gingerich Family Farms - Jonesville, VA

DO YOU FEED KEEPER RAM LAMBS DIFFERENTLY THAN KEEPER EWE LAMBS? GRAIN, HAY, PROTEIN, ETC.

Yes and no. Our ram lambs and ewe lambs are on the same feed ration; however the ram lambs do get pushed harder. Our lambs are fed out on a 16% ration from performance feeds, as well as free choice dry hay. We also try to keep a HI-Fat Purina protein tub out for them.

WHAT KIND OF GRASS SHOULD I USE FOR SHEEP PASTURES?

Being in Southwestern Virginia our main grass is fescue, we also plant some cool season annuals for them to graze in late fall and spring that consist of oats and rye.

WHAT IS THE AVERAGE SHEEP (KATAHDIN EWES) HD/ACRES AND EWE/LAMB PAIRS/ACRES?

You can easily run 4-5 per acre and more like 7 or 8 if you do rotational grazing.

Are protein tubs a good option? I have a small operation and for sure a beginner. If I provided a loose free choice sheep minerals and a less expensive protein tub, would this work well for supplementation?

We don't use protein tubs for anything other than lambs, we feed free choice minerals as well as some Mix 30 if supplementation is needed.

Aileen Scott, Aspen Mountain Katahdins - Butte, MT

Do you feed keeper ram lambs differently than keeper ewe lambs? Grain, hay, protein, etc.

My keeper lambs are all fed the same. I feed Alfalfa/grass mixed hay and no grain or concentrates.

What kind of grass should I use for

sheep pastures?

Pastures at this 6,200 ft. elevation are composed of cool season grasses native to the area.

What is the average sheep (Katahdin ewes) hd/acres and ewe/ Lamb pairs/acres?

This question is more difficult because I have a larger acreage than most and a small flock due to the increased price of hay in this area.

Are protein tubs a good option? I have a small operation and for sure a beginner. If I provided a loose free choice sheep minerals and a less expensive protein tub, would this work well for supplementation?

Good quality hay with free choice sheep mineral and salt is all they need. Alfalfa hay provides all the protein necessary even for pregnant ewes. If they can't do well and thrive on this, they are culled.

2023 South Central Katahdin Association Gathering

The 2023 SCKA Gathering returned to Vicksburg, Mississippi on June 2nd and 3rd. Producers received: the opportunity to hear speakers from around the country, win door prizes, eat considerable food, and network with other Katahdin producers.

Kick-off began on Friday afternoon with a presentation from Dr. Leyla Rios from the Mississippi State Extension Service. Dr. Rios brought the "Taking the Lab to the Farm" program to the SCKA. A full Power Point presentation was given with a hands-on demonstration using all the tools to do a complete fecal analysis for nematodes. Dr. Rios along with two of her graduate students walked members from taking fecal sample through determining the number of eggs in the sample. This program was well-received and generated a number of questions from members. This training is predicted to help producers make better management decisions in controlling the barber pole worms in their flock. Dr. Rios has an Animal Science degree and a M.S. in Animal Production/Nutrition from La Universidad Central de Venezuela (UCV) and a Ph.D. in Interaction Nutrition-Parasites from the University of Edinburgh and the Moredun Research Institute (Scotland, UK).

To round out the evening, an official Hair Coat Inspection training was made available to members. This was an outstanding opportunity and presentation by Howard Covington. Howard is a longtime Katahdin producer and SCKA member. He is currently on the Board of Directors with the Katahdin Hair Sheep International.

Saturday morning continued with Erin Wood giving a sizeable presentation on Fall Lambing due to an increasing number of members that have expressed interest in Fall Lambing. The information Erin presented was precisely informative and well received. A number of questions were generated due to aforementioned presentation. Erin Wood is an Animal Scientist at the USDA, Agricultural Research Service, Dale Bumpers Small Farms Research Center in: Booneville, AR. Erin received her Master's degree

in animal science from the University of Arkansas, and her Bachelors in Agricultural Business from Arkansas Tech University.

Dr. Leyla Rios returned again Saturday morning with a presentation on Parasite Management. As always, her program was very informative. This took the Saturday program to a higher level. Dr. Rios has given presentations for several years for the SCKA. Each has been an asset to the Gathering.



2023 Texas Sheep Field Day

Texas ranks first in the nation for sheep production. While sheep can be found throughout the Lone Star State, most of the commercial activity is surprisingly centralized, within 300 miles of the semiarid city of San Angelo. In dusty pastures that average 20 inches of rain a year and where 100-degree temperatures are common during summer months, ranchers run Rambouillet, Delaine-Merino, Columbia, Corriedale, Suffolk, Hampshire, Southdown, Dorset, Dorper, and others. Internal parasites can exact a heavy toll under these conditions, and the emergence of treatment resistant strains has opened an opportunity to introduce a versatile and more parasite-resistant option: the Katahdin breed.

The South Central Katahdin Association (SCKA) hosted a Sheep Field Day on April 15th in Gatesville, Texas, located within the centralized area of Texas' greatest sheep production. Five event organizers put together a program to educate sheep producers and

highlight the Katahdin breed. Howard Covington headed up the group, with Marti Carlson, Heidi Barber, Clifford Spraberry, and Bill Brown taking on essential roles. KHSI sponsored the event with financial assistance and

materials for a nice dis-

play table.

The day was wellorganized as evidenced by an automated RSVP system, an attractive sixpage program, printed name tags, handouts, and a free lunch. Most learned about the Field Day through the marketing campaign of Marti Carlson, which involved frequent social media updates across multiple groups, emails, a maga-

zine advertisement, and a mass mailing. Attendance exceeded expectations with 130 participants. As a bonus, 78 of those present were not members of any Katahdin association and represented a rich opportunity to promote not only the Katahdin breed but SCKA. Heidi Barber acted as the local liaison with the Gatesville Civic Center, the Coryell County Texas AgriLife Extension Office, while also recruiting most of the vendors for


> the event, along with securing raffle ticket

prizes.

Five experienced speakers headed up the education portion of the day. Kent Mills spoke about small ruminant nutritional needs, emphasizing shifting demands during maintenance, gain, gestation, and lactation. Jake Thorne presented a multifaceted approach to

reducing internal parasite loads in sheep. Jake specifically recognized the success of progressive Katahdin breeders over the last decade in reducing post-weaning fecal egg counts





Join us on Facebook: Salmon-Run-Farms while increasing the number of lambs weaned by use of NSIP data. Dr. Vanessa Corriber-Olson spoke on the topic of pasture management, noting that pastures recover from common adverse events much more quickly when they are carefully cared for. Zachary Hagan covered the topic of marketing to maximize profits. During his presentation, he used live Katahdin sheep in the arena to demonstrate selection criteria. Dr. Sandi Parriott, a veterinarian, spoke on the topic of flock health management and preventative medicine. She emphasized, "If you have good nutrition, you're going to prevent most of the common diseases." Dr. Parriott also conducted two hands-on skill sessions, one on how to conduct fecal egg counts and another on how to assess basic sheep health.

Lunch was a wonderful success, with lamb provided by HSC Katahdins through Howard Covington.

Over lunch, participants socialized as they talked about their sheep, operations, and aspirations. Bill Brown and Clifford Sprayberry organized a Private Treaty Sale, where 25 Katahdin sheep were on display. During




the lunch break, participants enjoyed walking from pen to pen, talking with producers, and even handling some of the well-conformed animals. One par-

ticipant was surprised at how docile and easy to handle the sheep were. "My sheep are not like that," she said of her non-Katahdin operation.

The 2023 Texas Sheep Field Day was a success by many measures: written and verbal participant feedback was very positive, the SCKA saw a boost in new memberships, folks expressed an interest in attending future Katahdin events, and a surge was observed in social media groups commenting about the quality of the day. If the Katahdin breed is to make gains into Texas, it will likely be through new relationships, strengthened ties, and quality promotional events like the one held in Gatesville. This approach is consistent with the spirit of the Katahdin community known by many of us from coast to coast and summed up by author Napoleon Hill: "It is literally true that you can succeed best and quickest by helping others to succeed.'
